Humber Frontage Work.

Following a detailed review of the existing tidal flood defences along the Humber, funding was secured in Dec 2017 to deliver a £42 million flood defence scheme to upgrade this stretch of flood defences. This is in order to better protect homes and businesses that are at risk of flooding from the Humber Estuary. Our review has concluded that improved flood defences are required in approximately 7km of the 19km study area, at 9 locations along the frontage. The scheme will reduce the risk of flooding to 113,000 properties.

Why is this work necessary? In 2008, our Humber Flood Risk Management Strategy identified that in the near future some of the tidal flood defences around the city of Hull could require further investigation into their condition and the level of protection they offer. This work is to upgrade the stretch of tidal defences to ensure that they provide adequate flood protection. Hull Frontage Improvement scheme will start in late summer 2018 and be complete by the end of 2020.

Slipway pond:

Local councillors Diana Hatcher, Linda Chambers and Adam Williams are pressing the Council's Parks Department for a long-term maintenance plan for the duck pond, behind the Winding House on Plimsoll Way. Over the years, the pumping system for the water has broken numerous times - and the reeds are often badly overgrown.

Promenade fishing hooks

Siemens

The Humber has become "the envy of the world" as offshore wind powers a revolution in affordable green energy generation, a major industry conference will hear. Siemens Gamesa Renewable Energy is the headline Diamond Sponsor of the Offshore Wind Connections conference, organised by Team Humber Marine Alliance, which will draw leading industry figures from the UK and abroad.

Preparatory work has now begun to manufacture even larger 81.5m blades, for Siemens Gamesa's next generation 8MW turbines. Production will be in time to supply Ørsted's huge Hornsea 2 offshore wind farm, which will be the latest to raise the bar as the world's largest. "It's testament to what has been achieved in Hull that, so soon after the site has been established, we have confidence that it will be the location to build even bigger blades," said Mr Thompson.
