Rooted in Hull Explanation

Rooted in Hull (RiH) brings the concept of a 'farm in a box' directly into the centre of Hull. Sited on a derelict piece of land in the city on St Peter's Street (next to the post office), the project aims to revolutionise how the local community view, eat and celebrate fresh food. The farm will be built on free-standing platforms - shipping containers, planters, moveable boxes - the idea being that if the land they are situated on changes use, the farm can literally up and move to another unused piece of land in the city. Working in partnership with local business, RiH will adapt vacant development sites in the centre of the city for fruit and vegetable growing, fish farming and bee keeping and education regarding livestock keeping. Working in partnership with local schools, homeless charities and those furthest from employment, RiH will make good quality food understandable and accessible to all. Participants will develop employability skills and experience and develop confidence and self-efficacy.

By developing a shop and café with opportunities for other food and catering businesses (e.g. a mill and bakery, aquaponics and speciality mushroom farming using waste coffee grounds), RiH will provide support for local and community-based micro enterprises.

Rooted in Hull working with the local residents.

As Rooted in Hull is being developed we are keen to involve and be involved with the Victoria Dock residents. This is a unique venture for Hull and one which works across many social, educational and business organisations. We are looking for residents who actively want to be involved in some way from volunteering to maybe offering ideas, especially as we are looking at developing new technology systems around growing plants, LED, hydroponics, aquaponics, mushroom growing, flour milling. In fact anything around food and growing.

"The vast majority of those fishing are responsible and take their rubbish away with them," said Diana. "Unfortunately a small minority have been leaving their waste behind, which has caused significant stress to a number of dog owners."

Diana, Linda and Adam have been in touch with local angling clubs about the issues - who have agreed to make their members aware of the issues. They're also working to get the Council to put up some new signage along the promenade reminding people to take their rubbish home with them - whether it is fish hooks, dog mess or any other kind of litter.
