


The Citadel



ABP

“Works on constructing the new terminal at Green Port Hull are nearing completion with a likely end date in January 2017, from which time the whole facility will be under Siemens control. Progress has been good in recent weeks, and it is anticipated that most plant and machinery used in construction will be offsite by Christmas.

The works to the historic building on site are also nearly finished, after which there will be consideration as to their future as a potential Visitor’s Centre. At the end of October, the project was commended by the Hull Civic Society for its positive impact, with ABPO and the artists attending an awards ceremony where they were presented with a citation.

As we approach completion, ABP would like to thank the Residents of Victoria Dock for their patience during the works, we have tried to be as open as possible about issues that have affected the community, and look forward to continuing the relationship once the facility becomes fully operational.”

Siemens

The Blade Factory is now in production and we are progressing very well. We have already recruited over 500 people and expect to have 700 people in the factory early in the new year. The harbour operations are progressing well. We now have control of 1 of the 3 new river berths. We are currently preparing components ahead of the first load out which will happen in January. We have taken delivery of Nacelles and Towers. The Towers are in 3 parts and are currently being erected alongside the new river berth. We look forwards to taking control of the remainder of the site early in the new year.

Supporting 2016 Stay Well This Winter

Victoria Dock Village Hall is supporting the 2016 Stay Well This Winter campaign.

The Stay Well This Winter campaign is a joint initiative from NHS England and Public Health England, to help people with long-term health conditions and those over 65 prepare for winter and ward off common winter illnesses.

Winter can be seriously bad for the health of these people, increasing the risk of blood pressure, heart attacks and strokes. There are a number of things you can do to prepare against the cold weather -

- At the first sign of a cough or cold, get immediate advice from your pharmacist before it gets more serious.
- Speak to your pharmacist about medicines you should have in stock over winter.
- Pick up prescription medications before the Christmas holidays start as many GPs and pharmacies will close over the holidays.
- It is important to keep warm in winter, so heat your home to at least 18°C (65°F), if you can, you might prefer your living room to be slightly warmer.
- Make sure you get your flu jab.

If you need help over the holiday period when your GP surgery or pharmacy is closed, call NHS 111 or visit www.nhs.uk.

If you are pregnant flu can cause serious complications for you and your baby - you could both get seriously ill. Vaccination is the safest way to help protect you and your baby against flu. So don't put it off, ask your GP, pharmacist or midwife about the free flu jab today. It's free because you need it, however many months pregnant you are and however fit and healthy you might feel.

For children aged 2, 3 and 4, the flu vaccine is not an injection, just a quick nasal spray available through your GP. This year children in school years 1, 2 and 3 are also eligible for the nasal spray administered at school in most parts of the country and via GP surgeries in some areas.
